He also said the Board members should read the By-laws once a year.

A discussion was then had on the value of school boards and a video was shown.

As part of a conversation around unity of purpose, Board members were then asked (without discussion) what percentage of District students are succeeding. Answers ranged from 37 to 80%. The meaning of success was then discussed, and the Board was asked what decisions they feel contributed the most to student achievement this year. The Board discussed what they hoped would be major improvements over the next 10 years.

After a short half hour lunch break, roles of the Board and Superintendent were discussed. Mr. Lamb then asked what the goals of the District are. He said there seems to be a disconnect between stated goals and those included in the Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) of 1) Safe, Clean and Healthy Schools; 2) Family and Community Engagement; and 3) College and Career Ready Students. Mr. Lamb suggested creating a monitoring plan and a governance calendar. He said one of the most difficult goals is to get buy
