Limitation for 2023-24 and the Gann Amendment Calculation for 2022-23.

**Background/Rationale** : The Gann Limit (named for Paul Gann, the author of Proposition No. 4, which amended the State Constitution to establish this limit), is intended to constrain the growth in state and local government spending by linking year-to-year changes in expenditures to changes in inflation and population. Inflation for these purposes is currently the annual percentage change in California per capita personal income. For school agencies, change in Average Daily Attendance is used as

**RESOLUTION TO ESTIMATE GANN APPROPRIATION  
LIMITATION FOR 2023-24**

**WHEREAS**, the California electorate did adopt at the November election of 1979, Proposition No. 4, commonly known as the "Gann-Walker Proposition," which amended the California Constitution to limit the amount of state funds that may be allocated to local governments;

**WHEREAS**, the provisions of that amendment establish maximum appropriation limitations, which apply to all local government districts; and
